Special Needs Kids Sailing Day Scheduled for
Wednesday, 9/27

Time: 8 A.M. to 2 P.M.

Location: Stanley Lake, Westminster / Arvada

On Wednesday September 27, 2006 from 8 A.M. to 2 P.M., Community Sailing, The Boy Scouts and public schools have partnered to get 175 Special Needs Kids sailing at Stanley Lake. These kids range in age from 9-17, have a multitude of physical and or cognitive problems in their life; some are deaf, some are blind, some are autistic, some come from poor or abusive families; all come from a lot of different backgrounds. Community Sailing needs volunteers to help give rides so all these disadvantaged kids can get on the water. Last year we were able to get 165 Special Needs Youth on-the-water sailing in Lasers, Butterflies, Sunfish, and a host of other daysailors. You should have seen the smiles when they came off the water last year.

Can you volunteer and come out and help? Community Sailing will provide boats; or sailors can bring their own boats. Community Sailing needs more than 35 volunteers to make this program work. Not all the volunteers need to know how to sail. We need at least 9 shoreside volunteers to help get life jackets on the kids and coordinate kids getting on

and off boats. Rides will be approximately 20 minutes.

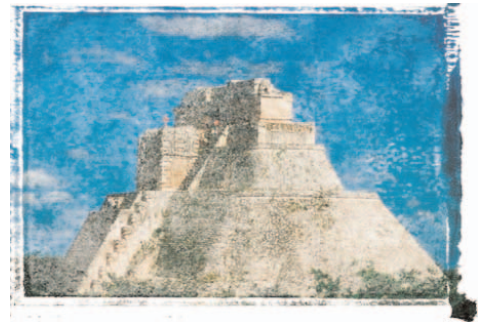


A-K Bring Dessert
