Code of Conduct for Junior Sailors

Please send this form with your registration papers.

To be successful, you should adopt the qualities of a good sailor, which include:

1. Always working to improve your sailing skills.
2. Obeying the rules of right-of-way on the water (in the booklet you will get)
3. Good sailors plan ahead and have a back-up plan. Example: As you come to the dock you realize that you are not lined up correctly for good docking. So, you turn around and go back out and try again.
4. Good sailors keep the boat, related gear, and him/herself in "ship shape". Examples: You don't leave the dock with broken or damaged equipment on your boat. You fix it first. You leave the dock always wearing your life jacket. You make sure that lines are tidy and not where anyone could trip on them.

Good sailors live by a sailor's code of conduct that other sailors rely on:

1. A good sailor gives assistance to others on the water. Example: If someone goes overboard and needs help on the water, you either get help or give help.
2. A good sailor is honest. Example: If you find something on the dock, you will leave it for the owner or try to return it, as appropriate.
3. A good sailor communicates in a helpful manner. Example: Talk respectfully and clearly to your crew. Communicate appropriately and clearly with others if on the water there is an issue of right-of-way.
4. A good sailor demonstrates self-discipline and acts responsibly. Example: You take time to put your boat away properly so it is not a problem for anyone else, even when you might feel too tired.

1. I will do my best to be a good sailor as outlined above.
2. I will follow the program rules.
3. I will pay attention to instructions and heed requests on the water and off.
4. I will display appropriate speech, conduct, and clothing. In other words, I will have a good attitude (not swear or sulk), and I will wear sensible and modest clothing.
